Who We Are

The Equitable Engagement Team is dedicated to supporting the needs and desires of people residing along the Fayetteville St Corridor. We believe the best insight around community development needs comes from the people who live in that community and are committed to seeing it prosper.

We believe that community organization, integration, and inclusive equitable representation are essential when working towards building a community in which we all can thrive.

We acknowledge that people, local businesses, institutions, natural resources, and relations bring vast value to our communities.

We would like to utilize the valuable input of 5 residents of the Fayetteville St. corridor who would like to serve as Leadership Team members by completing our eight (8) week, paid Organizing Fellowship. This Leadership Team will advise the City on ways to ensure the needs of the residents of the Fayetteville St Corridor are taken into consideration.

What is the Organizing Fellowship?

This Fellowship will focus on building and expanding the ability to utilize community power to influence the City of Durham's development plans in your neighborhood.

Your knowledge of what your community needs is invaluable. This Fellowship provides an exciting opportunity to collaborate with other passionate community leaders in the design, implementation, and evaluation of innovative approaches to increase civic participation.

Upon successful completion of this eight (8) week Fellowship, you will be a member of the inaugural Fayetteville Street Leadership Team. You will lead the planning and execution of events, training workshops and more. Your ideas, your choices!

Time Commitment

The anticipated time commitment is a total of 40 hours over 8 weeks (approximately 5 hours per week). Weekly work dates and times will be decided as a team at the retreat in March. Scheduling of all meetings and events will be done in collaboration with the Leadership Team members to accommodate your availability.

Activities include:

- One 'Meet the Team' introductory retreat (6 hours)
- Weekly 2-hour meetings
- Phone check-ins and logistic calls with the support team, as needed
- 3 community engagement events led and run by this team
- Concluding Organizing Fellowship celebration at the end of the program

Participants are required to attend the interest meeting, retreat and all 8 sessions of the Organizing Fellowship. We will excuse up to two (2) absences for emergency reasons. Missing more than two (2) weekly sessions will disqualify you from completing the Fellowship and receiving compensation.

Organizing Skills

You will learn how to collectively run a successful outreach campaign while setting and meeting attainable goals around community engagement. You will also have the opportunity to acquire new skills through training.

Compensation

All Fellows will receive a stipend of \$1200 for the eight (8) week program. We will provide a monthly bus pass, refreshments for weekly meetings and childcare. Please attend all eight (8) sessions.

We will excuse up to two (2) sessions in the case of an emergency. For each absence, \$200 will be deducted from your total compensation. No compensation will be awarded to those who miss more than two (2) sessions or for those with an unexcused absence.

Communication is key. Please inform us of any challenges.

Ideal Applicants

People with an interest in leadership, community and volunteering efforts around the Fayetteville Street Corridor.

Applicants must commit to the eight (8) week timeline by attending weekly 2 hour sessions and fulfilling outreach goals.

We strongly encourage women, people of color, LGBTQIA, elders, people with disabilities and those who have lived in the area for more than 10 years to apply for this Fellowship.

- 4. Commit to surveying community members and submitting feedback to the City of Durham

- 6. Plan and execute three (3) community engagement events
- 7. Attend the final Organizing Fellowship celebration
