With Barbara at the helm, the group scored hit after #1 hit including "Secret Lovers", "If Your Heart Isn't In It" and the perennial classic, "Always". Though the group had a female vocalist before Barbara and after Barbara, no vocalist is as closely identified with Atlantic Starr as Barbara Weathers.

Because Atlantic Starr toured extensively throughout Europe, Asia and the U.S., Barbara built up an extremely loyal following and in 1989 she left the group to pursue a solo career with Warner Bros. Records. Her first project was the critically acclaimed self-titled album," Barbara Weathers," produced by Maurice White of Earth, Wind and Fire.

Her second solo album, "Seeing For the Very First Time," was produced by Jeffrey Weber and released solely in Japan where it was a huge success, selling out within a week. The album included the hit song, "Love of My Life", produced by Maurice White and performed by Barbara in both English and Japanese.

For her latest release, "Satisfaction Guaranteed," Barbara once again teamed up with renowned producer Jeffrey Weber to deliver the most intimate and personal recording of her career thus far. This recording gives the listener insight to both her spiritual and playful sides.
